UBRFC PROTOCOLS

- 1. Behaviour must be acceptable at all times. You are an ambassador of the University of Bristol and the rugby club.
- 2. Dress Code: Wear the club kit for all matches and observe the after-match dress code (Shirt & tie).
- 3. If you are unable to play for any reason, your team captain must be informed immediately.
- 4. For away games, players must arrive at the specified meeting point 15 minutes before departure.
- 5. Be punctual for training and matches (Lombardi Time).

SELECTION POLICY

- 1. Selection will be on merit.
- 2. A commitment to training nights is a considerable factor in a player's favour.
- 3. If a player is unavailable, he must accept the risk of losing his place.
- 4. If there are any complaints about selection, please talk to your Captain.

ABOUT TRAINING

- 1. All players should be ready to train before the scheduled time.
- 2. Inform your captain in good time, if you are unavailable to train. Have a good reason.

ABOUT MATCHES

- 1. Wear the proper club kit and look a team.
- 2. Respect the bus on away trips no bottles or damage.
- 3. Respect your team-mates by being sensible and preparing properly the night before a match.
- 4. Socialise with the opposition in the club bar after matches

COOMBE DINGLE

- 1. Treat Coombe Dingle its staff, fields, changing rooms and facilities with respect
- 2. Dispose of litter (bottles/tape etc) in the bins provided

<u>IF YOU ARE INJURED</u>

- 1. Injuries sustained on the training field will be dealt with as required.
- 2. SERIOUS INJURIES Consult your GP
- 3. Notify your captain immediately. Explain the extent of the injury and how long you will be unavailable.
- 4. When injured for any length of time, a player should update the club injury document (Contact Louis Butler).

PREVENTION OF INJURY

- 1. Players must wear mouth guards.
- 2. Medical supports which you require e.g. ankle/knee supports, should be purchased by you.
- 3. Get tetanus cover from your GP
- 4. Players are advised to take out a Personal Accident Insurance Policy.

What is the Code of Conduct?

This Code of Conduct sets out the expected behaviour of university rugby players when participating in any activity, including informal social events, under the name of University of Bristol. It is designed to reduce the risk of harm, injury and nuisance to members and the community in general and ensure the highest possible standards of competition, sportsmanship, fairness, honesty and behaviour in relation to the conduct of all players representing the University of Bristol.

The University of Bristol regard any breach of this Code as a serious matter and may take disciplinary action against an individual, team or club acting in breach of the Code.

General code of conduct (this is a selection)

All players agree to abide by the terms outlined below:

- 1. Understand the repercussions of any breaches of this Code.
 - 2. Behave in a manner which does not endanger or cause nuisance to others.
- Act responsibly at all times and to avoid actions which could bring the club, University or sponsors into disrepute.
 - 4. Conduct themselves in a reasonable manner relating to language, noise and behaviour.
 - 5. Compete in a manner of good sportsmanship
- Treat facilities, staff and students at the University of Bristol and other institutions with the utmost respect.
- Refrain from any form of harassment of others and respect the rights, dignity and values of others.
- 8. Not encourage or pressure others into acting against the $\operatorname{\mathsf{Code}}$.
- Not carry out initiation ceremonies as detailed below.
 Not be unduly intoxicated at any event or activity where such behaviour could be deemed unacceptable or unprofessional.
- 11. Not to consume alcohol whilst being transported to or from any activity organised under the umbrella of the University.
 - 12. Not act in an unlawful manner.

B. Initiations *

- 1. The University of Bristol do not permit Initiation Ceremonies*.
- 2. Social activities such as welcome evenings, team meals, social nights and celebration events that welcome new members and to give a positive first impression of university life are encouraged, providing the following rules are followed:
 - a. All activities must be opt-in and have no bearing on the acceptance into the team/ squad selection etc.
 - b. Peer pressure must not be exerted on individuals.
 - c. Activities must not be humiliating, unlawful or degrading to the individual or wider.
 - d. Activities must not involve the forced consumption of any fluid/substance.
 - e. If activities involve alcohol then non-alcoholic drinks must be made available as an alternative.
 - f. Activities must not bring the reputation of University of Bristol or the Rugby Club into question or disrepute.

Club Captains will be held personally responsible for any Initiation Ceremonies that take place and will run the risk of being suspended or expelled from University should any instances occur.

* An initiation ceremony is an event at which members of the club are expected to perform an activity as a means of gaining credibility, status or entry into that club. This peer pressure is normally exerted on first year students or new members and may involve the consumption of alcohol, eating various foods, nudity and behaviour that may be deemed humiliating.

What happens if the Code is breached?

If UBU receives information which indicates an activity may be in breach of this Code it shall, if deemed appropriate, inform the University and will then:

- 1. Contact the Club in question to obtain further information and to check if any action has or will be taken.
- 2. Investigate the alleged breach, and if satisfied that a breach may have occurred, refer the matter to the UBU Disciplinary Committee, which consists of the appropriate Vice President (Sport & Health or Activities), Vice-Chair of the appropriate Executive Committee, Activities & Participation Manager, SEH Sports Development Manager and, if appropriate, a representative of University staff.
- 3. Convene a meeting of the UBU Disciplinary Committee, make a ruling on the breach and issue punishments befitting the severity of the breach of the Code.
- 4. Where it is believed the University's, disciplinary procedures may have been broken the incident will be referred to the University.
- 5. In some cases, incidents may be reported direct to the University, in which case all efforts will be made to report the incident to UBU and inform it of any action taken by the University and any investigation and/or action to be taken by UBU.

Sanctions for breaching the Code

Any breach of this Code of Conduct may result in one or more of the following (please note this is not an exhaustive list):

- 1. Fine(s) (individual or Club or both)
- 2. Removal of grant funding and/or the ability to apply for future funding
- 3. Removal of team(s) or individuals from BUCS Competition
- 4. Removal of club from BUCS Competition
- 5. Down-grading of club status e.g. removal of Focus Sport status or moving from the Silver to Bronze tier
- 6. Disbandment of Club or Expulsion of the individual from the Club or Expulsion of the individual from UBU (preventing the individual from joining other student groups)
- 7. Individual Disciplinary Proceedings by the University

If an incident occurs at the end of an academic year the sanction(s) may be levied for the following year.

Glossary of terms

Focus Sports – Specific sports have been granted Focus Sport status by SEH to reflect their commitment to high performance, good management and development of the sport. These clubs are offered facility time and paid coaching time.

SEH – the University's Centre for Sport, Exercise and Health.

Tiering – Sports clubs are placed in one of three tiers - bronze, silver or gold - based on their size, professionalism, development and opportunities provided. The tier affects the maximum grant available to a club.
